One of the major pillar and strength of Skill India Mission of Government of India are Sector Skill Councils (SSCs), which play a vital role in bridging the gap between what the industry demands and what the skilling requirements ought to be. The SSCs play an important role for the employer/industry by connecting their demand for skilled manpower with the Vocational Education & Training system.

Rubber Skill Development Council (RCPSDC) is a sector skill council promoted by All India Rubber Industries Association (AIRIA), Automotive Tyre Manufacturers' Association (ATMA), National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) and operates under the aegis of Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE).

RCPSDC is set up to bring rubber sector together to create strategies and operational plans that will create standardized skill requirements for the various job roles in the industry. RCPSDC ensures that the training is relevant to industry needs and it is aligned with the national skill development policy. RCPSDC has developed a robust training delivery mechanism that follows international standards and quality parameters. RCPSDC is supported by various stakeholders in nation-building activity of creating a pool of skilled workforce in the sector and empower youth of our country.

STATEMENT OF WORK

National Occupational Standards (NOS)

National Occupational Standards (NOS) chart the standard and performance along with the knowledge and understanding, required to carry out the functions at a workplace. Our country's current skill ecosystem is completely woven around these NOS, which have contributed towards the development of a standardized and high quality Vocational Education System. The standards have successfully brought everyone into the "learning cycle". It is now being used for a variety of purposes which includes, skill reviews, developing job descriptions, recruitment and selection, training needs analysis and provides benchmarks of effective practice.

NOS - The National Occupational Standards (NOS) specify the standard of performance an individual must achieve when carrying out a function in the workplace, together with the knowledge and understanding they need to meet a standard consistently.

QP - The NOS are laid down by employers (through their SSCs). A Qualification Pack (QP) is a set of NOS aligned to a job role. A QP is available for every job role in each industry sector. These drive both the creation of curriculum and assessments. Thus, the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) theoretically makes it possible to drive competency based training for every job role in industry.

- With the merger of Chemical and Petrochemical Sector, 37 Qualification packs for Petrochemicals have been brought under the purview of SSC.

c) RPL – Best in Class Employer under PMKVY scheme

In order to enhance the industry acceptability of RPL certification and extend the outreach of the scheme directly to reputed employers/industries across the sectors,

it is proposed to introduce "RPL—Best in Class Employer". This project type would ensure a wider outreach to the large uncertified workforce across the country, primarily in the organized sector, through direct partnerships with sector skill councils and industry/corporate.



Collaboration with the top employers shall help to enhance credibility of certification and help to promote mobility of the workforce across the sector. The industry will also benefit from their workforce being certified under the National Skill Qualification

Framework (NSQF). Achieve economy and scale through a simplified procedure of assessment through manager/supervisor/department head for the other employees of his/her department. Cobranded certification to incentivize the industry.

National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) scheme under MSDE

- The objective of the NAPS scheme is to promote apprenticeship training and to increase the engagement of apprentices.
- Sharing of 25% of prescribed stipend, subject to a maximum of INR 1500/- per month per apprentice with the employers. The stipend support would not be given during the basic training period of fresh apprentices.
- Sharing basic training cost in respect of 20% apprentices who come directly to apprenticeship training without any formal trade training. The basic training cost will be limited to INR 5250/- for a 350-hour course.

Assessments & Certification:

The prime objective of developing National Occupational Standards is to train and assess the trainee on skills, competency and knowledge at NOS level. Assessment criterion has been defined for each NOS, and it includes both theoretical and practical skills on which the trainee will be assessed. The evaluation of the competencies accomplished by the trainees is conducted through a comprehensive assessment process. Post the assessments, successful trainees are certified by RCPSDC.

Due-Diligence Process:

Assessment agencies are empanelled after completion of the Due Diligence process of NSDC. In the Due Diligence process, Assessment Agencies have to score a minimum of 60%, as per Evaluation matrix, in order to get provisionally empanelled by the SSC.

RCPSDC team visited the assessment agency head office to inquire about assessment methodology and operating procedures. This process has been conducted by the RCPSDC team for all 7 empanelled

Key Engagements

- Assessments of all the trainees, trained by RCPSDC's affiliated training providers, are conducted by RCPSDC's accredited assessment agency.
- Assessment agency empanels assessors and Subject Matter Experts from the Industry or academic institutes, for conducting the assessments effectively.
- The Assessment Agencies use tablets for conducting the assessments.
- Trainees are being assessed on theoretical as well as practical skills, to ensure that they are readily deployable by the industry.
- The successful trainees are issued with a joint certificate from Govt. of India, NSDC and RCPSDC.





Key Events of Last Year

Governing Council Meetings, RCPSDC

37th GC Meet of RCPSDC was held on Saturday, 10th July, 2021 at 11 am on Virtual Mode (Zoom Platform)

Key Highlights

- The Chairman informed the Governing Council(GC) that the name of the council was changed from Rubber Skill Development Council(RSDC) to Rubber, Chemical and Petrochemical Skill Development Council(RCPSDC).
- GC members were updated with the news of registration of a new office space for RCPSDC.
- The GC was briefed on the progress of RCPSDC. The members were informed that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, all the trainings across the country were on hold and therefore, no work allocation has been processed by State Skill Development Missions and NSDC.
- It was shared with the GC members that RCPSDC had submitted a proposal for 10,000 sq ft area in INKEL Tower, Near TELK, Angamaly, Ernakulam, Kerala. The proposal has been shortlisted and KASE invited RCPSDC for the technical presentation with the business advisory committee of KASE (Kerala) and officials of KASE.
- GC was also updated about the proposal which IRMRA & RCPSDC have jointly submitted to the MSME department of Tripura to set up a technology centre which would allocate training targets and provide funding for skill development programmes, which was approved at the state level.
- RCPSDC has also submitted a proposal to Bihar State Skill Development Mission (BSDM) for setting up centres and support in allocating targets. Secretary of Labour & Employment department in Bihar had agreed to provide government space for setting up centres. Two industry members i.e., Royal Elastomer Pvt Ltd & Prem Footwear Pvt Ltd have will be submitting the proposal to BSDM in collaboration with RCPSDC.
- It was shared with the GC members that Ajitakash Skills, RCPSDC's affiliated training partner is setting up Centre of Excellence for Natural Rubber Plantation job roles in Dubri, Assam. The Proposal has been principally approved by Assam Skill Development Mission (ASDM) and formal proposal and MoU have been submitted to ASDM for their review and approval.
- GC was also updated that in Q1, 822 trainees were enrolled, 358 assessed and 464 assessments are on hold due to COVID restrictions across the country.
- The NOS & SGA sub-committees for Petrochemical have been formed. RCPSDC had issued an RFP for empanelment of agency for conducting SGA in five states i.e.





Maharashtra, Gujarat (with inclusion of Daman and Silvasa), Tamil Nadu, Delhi NCR and Assam to be covered in Phase I. Seven agencies showed their interest and three agencies i.e. E&Y, PwC and Amass were shortlisted for the technical presentation to the SGA subcommittee members. Basis the final scoring, PwC had the highest score and was unanimously approved by the members to award the contract. The total project cost is Rs 29,41,280+ applicable taxes.

- ICC has agreed to be on board with RCPSDC for creating the ecosystem of skilling for the Chemical Sector.
- In Q1 of FY 2021-22, 30 new companies registered under the NAPS scheme and 913 contracts were signed. As on date (10th July, 2021), RCPSDC has got 654 companies registered, 6451 total opportunities created and 5170 contracts signed.
- It was also shared with the GC members that under the CSR Bridgestone Project Implementation, a total of 13 batches of the Commercial Tyre Fitters have been trained in 13 different districts of Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and Madhya Pradesh. A total of 277 candidates have been enrolled and assessed successfully so far.

38th GC Meet of RCPSDC held on Wednesday, 1st September, 2021 at 11:30 am at Hotel Sheraton, Saket, New Delhi (also on virtual mode)

Key Highlights

- It was briefed to the GC on the progress of the projects in Q1 & Q2, 2,428 trainees were enrolled and 1,521 assessed, 541 assessments are on hold due to COVID restrictions in some of the states across the country.
- Haryana State Skill Development Mission has allocated 800 RPL targets for the Tyre Fitter job roles.
- GC was updated that RCPSDC has submitted a proposal to the Department of Mission Shakti, Odisha for skilling & setting up enterprises for footwear manufacturing for the SHGs.
- GC was also updated about the proposal which IRMRA & RCPSDC have jointly submitted to the MSME department of Tripura to set up a technology centre. In this project, the land, building and infrastructure set up will be funded by MSME and the Tripura State Skill Development Mission will allocate training targets and provide funding for skill development programs.
- In the new NAPS scheme promoted by MSDE & NSDC, 25% of the prescribed stipend subject to a maximum of INR 1500/- per month per apprentice is reimbursed to the employers. It was also shared that many industry partners have come forward and created basic training centres in their company shop floor in both rubber and plastic sector.
- The GC was informed that under the CSR Bridgestone Project Implementation, a





total of 14 batches of the Commercial Tyre Fitters have been trained in 13 different districts of Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana and Madhya Pradesh. A Total of 277 candidates have been enrolled and assessed successfully so far.

39th GC Meet of RCPSDC held on held on Wednesday, 30th November, 2021 at 11:30 am at Hotel Sheraton, Saket, New Delhi (also on virtual mode)

Key Highlight

- It was briefed to the GC on the progress of the projects by RCPSDC and the latest updates. Till Q2, 3,211 trainees were enrolled and 2,126 assessed in rubber job roles across the country was also informed.
- Haryana State Skill Development Mission has allocated 2400 RPL targets and Tamil Nadu State Skill Development Mission has also allocated 250 RPL targets.
- Yokohama Skill Development Center set up at Dahej Gujarat by the Yokohama Off-Highway Tires (YOHT) was launched on 18th Nov, 2021. The center aims to support the skill India mission and enhance employment opportunities by offering training through short term courses in rubber and Tyre manufacturing. Following are the RCPSDC job roles selected for training programs:
 - Mill Operator
 - Extruder Operator
 - Curing Chamber Operator
 - Tyre Building Operator: Off the Road
 - Radial Tyre building operator
- It was also shared with the GC members that RCPSDC had issued an RFP for empanelment of agency for conducting SGA in five states i.e. Maharashtra, Gujarat (with inclusion of Daman and Silvasa), Tamil Nadu, Delhi NCR and Assam to be covered in the Phase I and PwC was awarded the contract. The MoU was signed on 25th July between RCPSDC and PwC and the study has been initiated.
- RCPSDC has 717 companies registered, 10,340 total opportunities created and 7793 contracts signed on NAPS portal. Industries like Apollo tyres, TVS, MRF, Metro, Kohinoor Plastics and many more are on board as a Basic Training Provider and more than 20 third party Aggregator (TPA) are working in rubber, chemical and plastic sector under the scheme.
- GC was informed that RCPSDC has developed a digital learning platform, eKaushalacharya which is a one stop solution for providing training through instructionally designed e-courses, enriched with illustrations, infographics, animations and live videos.
- It was shared with the GC members that the details about the National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET) was notified in December 2018 and operationalized in July 2020 to act as an overarching skills regulator. It was shared with the GC members that RCPSDC has submitted the application for recognition of an Awarding Body for rubber, plastic & chemical sectors to NCVET.





40th GC Meet of RCPSDC held on Saturday, 28th March, 2022 at 10:30 am at Hotel Sheraton, New Delhi (also on virtual mode)

Key Highlight

- The GC was briefed that RCPSDC has submitted proposal directly to various ministries and state departments for direct allocation and 36,886 allocations are received.
- Maharashtra State Skill Development Society (MSSDS) has allocated 420 target to implement training programme in 10 districts of the state in plastic sector job roles under SANKALP. The enrolment has been completed and the batches are commenced.
- Under National Urban Livelihood Mission(NULM) scheme, RCPSDC has received targets of conducting short term training from Madhya Pradesh for 1000 numbers, Rajashthan has given 1400 numbers and Uttarakhand has allocated 540 targets.
- RCPSDC is working on a project with Tripura Other Backward Classes Cooperative Development Corporation for training 100 rubber workers.
- RCPSDC has also initiated to conduct school workshops and competition to create awareness about Plastic Waste Management segment of the sector.
- The GC was informed that RCPSDC has issued a RFP for empanelment of agency for conducting SGA in five states i.e., Maharashtra, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Assam and Delhi-NCR.
- The GC members were updated about the targets vs achievement for rubber and plastic vertical and same was approved by GC.
- It was informed to the Council members that RCPSDC has revamped the placement portal with more features.
