## Mr Vinod Patkotwar takes over as Chairman of RCPSDC

The Rubber, Chemical and Petrochemical Skill Development Council (RCPSDC) has announced the appointment of Mr Vinod Patkotwar as its new Chairman. # Rise in apprenticeship and job opportunities in Rubber & Plastic sector in Tamil Nadu

With the opening up of the economy and increase in infrastructure spend, the Rubber and Plastic sector is looking at significant growth in the ongoing fiscal year. Over 4,500 vacancies have been generated for apprenticeship and placement in the two sectors in the state of Tamil Nadu, said Ms Deepmala Moorjani, Senior Manager – Industry Connect, Chemical & Petrochemical Development Council in a statement after the just concluded Skill Meet at Chennai.



"Skill Meet has been developed by RCPSDC as a platform for bringing a large swathe of industries into the fold of the skilling ecosystem. A large section of industries, especially MSMEs, are still not conversant with the benefits that accrue from a skilled workforce. Skill Meet acts as a much-needed bridge to discuss the roadmap for a skilled manpower including Government schemes available and also to understand the skill based requirements of industries".

There are nearly 6,000 rubber and plastic manufacturing industries in Tamil Nadu. Several large players in the state have shown keen interest in hiring skilled manpower. These include MRF, Ceat Tyre, Apollo Tyres, Sundaram Industries, Minda, JBM Auto and Emerald Tyres, said Ms Annamma Jacob, Regional Manager – South, RCPSDC.

At the Skill Meet, National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) made a detailed presentation on the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) for the benefit of attending industry professionals.

"Ever since the launch of NAPS, RCPSDC has been promoting it aggressively amongst both the job aspirants and the manufacturing industries. So far over 15000 apprentices have enrolled under various rubber and plastic job roles with the leading manufacturing industries by RCPSDC so far. During the current year, this number is projected to be doubled as about 1000 industries have registered with RCPSDC in the rubber and plastic sectors".

Mr Satish Pawar, Director YSF, elaborated on the TPA functionality to handhold the entire working of the NAPS online portal and other operational support that TPAs may provide for the ease of the industries.



Dr Rupesh Rohan, Assistant Director & Centre Head at Indian Rubber Manufacturers Research Association (under DPIIT, Ministry of Commerce & Industry) delivered a special talk on "Compounding of Rubber: Paragon of Scientific Art".



The Skill Meet at Chennai had top representatives from 50 industries in the rubber, chemical and petrochemical sectors. These included Foams India, Altek Chemicals India Pvt, Rialto Enterprises, Scorpion Polymers, Emerald Resilient Tyre Mfrs. Pvt Ltd.

RCPSDC also introduced its Placement Portal which is rendering unique services in the form of a platform to the companies in the Rubber, Chemical and Plastic sectors to communicate about their vacancies and helping prospective employees find relevant opportunities to make a career in the sectors concerned.







# 'Apprenticeship cum Job Mela' on Rubber, Plastic & chemical sectors witnessed an overwhelming response



A session to introduce the job opportunities in the Rubber, Plastic and Chemical sectors in the form of 'Apprenticeship cum Job Mela' held at Government ITI Panvel, Mumbai attracted a large number of aspiring candidates and companies in three sectors.



The day-long event was organised by the Rubber, Chemical & Petrochemical Skill Development Council (RCPSDC) in collaboration with The Regional Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship Maharashtra, Directorate Vocational Education & Training, Maharashtra State and Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) on 20th June 2022.

Top Government officials from the state involved in skill development and vocational training besides HR heads of a large number of companies manufacturing rubber, plastic and chemical products participated in the event. Mr Vinod Patkotwar Chairman at RCPSDC welcomed the guests during the inauguration of the event.

A total of 418 candidates attended the Apprenticeship cum Job Mela' in which 22 companies participated. Nearly 60 candidates were shortlisted.

On the successful execution of the Job Fair, Mr Vinod Patkotwar Chairman at RCPSDC, quoted "Apprenticeship has emerged as one of the well-recognized models to get a skilled workforce for the industries. At the same time, an Apprenticeship training enables youth to have practical, on-the-job training that meets the requirements of the industry. Especially in Rubber & Plastic sectors, apprenticeship offers many opportunities to work in different areas from tyre moulding to extruding to injection moulding. Apprenticeship is a good way to bridge the skill gaps."

Elaborating on the benefits of apprenticeship, Ms Suchita Roy, Regional Manager – West, RCPSDC, said, "Apprenticeship will give an opportunity to students to get trained in the industry and get real time exposure to the working process. For the first time, RCPSDC has taken this initiative to conduct a sector specific job fair, so that students can appreciate the growth prospects better in that sector and plan their career accordingly."











Dr Chavan, Dy. Dir- Regional Directorate of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, Maharashtra congratulated RCPSDC for organizing a sector specific Apprentice Mela which is first of its kind and in sync with the Skill India Mission. He expressed full support in conducting such events in Maharashtra for the benefit of young aspiring youth of the country.

Mr Tarun Mhaske, Technical Advisor-GIZ spoke about different vocational training programs being conducted pan India for uplifting the lives of underprivileged candidates under Indo German Program for Vocational Education & Training.

Mr Vinay Patil, President, the Indian Specialty Chemical Manufacturer Association and Mr Sanjeeb Lahiri, Chief HRO- GRP Ltd represented the industries and apprised the students about the employment potential therein.

Mr Vinay Patil spoke about various job opportunities in the Chemical sector and how students can get themselves skilled by joining as an apprentice. He pointed to the huge demand for skilled manpower for various positions in the chemical industry and how students can shape good career growth in the chemical sector.

Mr Sanjeeb Lahiri shared an overview of the Rubber & Plastic industry, its future growth potential and how a company like GRP Ltd with its international presence is keen to hire skilled manpower from ITI and groom the candidates for future growth.

Thanking RCPSDC, all the dignitaries and HR heads, Mr Tikole, Vice-Principal -Panvel ITI said, students will benefit immensely from such sector-specific apprenticeship mela (s) and they need to have more such events. Raigad District being a chemical Zone has a huge demand for manpower which needs to be fulfilled, he said.
